This time around, he underwent both chemotherapy and a Bone Marrow Transplant (BMT), however his Bone Marrow Transplant was unsuccessful, and led to him becoming sicker. Ryan ended up on life support with a 5% chance of surviving. Amazingly, Ryan persevered, but that was not the end of his fight; he had to work very hard to regain his strength due to his time being immobile. At age 13, Ryan relapsed once again. He had to undergo yet

another Bone Marrow Transplant, this time donated from his dad, which was successful. Despite having to deal with the long-term effects from chemotherapy, life-long steroid use, and radiation, Ryan has luckily been in remission for 3 years now. After seeing not only what Ryan went through, but also watching the struggles of Bradley's grandmother who passed away from Multiple Myeloma, we knew that we had to participate in this incredible campaign and do everything we can to help people like Ryan who are affected by Leukemia and Lymphoma.
